Planning Your Session: Tips for Presenters



Here are some tips to help you plan a PD session about annotated diagrams. All of our materials are free and available to share in educational settings. You are welcome to download and edit these materials as needed. Please share attribution to Colorín Colorado.

What You Need

- Annotated Diagrams: Slide Deck
- PD Planning Tool (optional)
- Handouts from this guide (optional)
- Internet access

Before your session, we recommend that you look through the slide deck and speaker's notes to get familiar with the format, content, activities, and discussion questions. You can also use the PD Session Planning Tool, which is included in this guide.

Note: This session can be presented in person or online. If presenting in person, you may wish to invite participants to bring a device ahead of time and confirm online access for your session.

Timing

This slide deck will take around 45 minutes to complete, and bonus activities are included that can be used to extend the session. For shorter sessions, you can choose 1-2 activities. You can also consider:

- Holding a follow-up session for teachers to plan a lesson or PD activity using this strategy
- Planning an in-depth session or event where you can lead participants through a deep dive of the ELL
 Strategy Library
- Introducing this strategy in team, department, or PLC meetings
- Planning training sessions with different audiences, such as science teachers, ELL coaches, etc.

Discussion and Reflection

We have found that educators really enjoy the discussions they have in these sessions. Leave as much time for discussion as possible and invite partners or small groups to share their takeaways with the bigger group to extend everyone's learning.





Annotated Diagrams: Activities

The Annotated Diagrams slide deck includes the following topics and activities. Many activities include discussion questions, and activities with handouts are noted below. The slide deck also includes a brief introduction to the ELL Strategy Library at the beginning.

Annotated Diagrams: Overview

Participants learn about annotated diagrams, how to use them, and how to incorporate students' languages into their use of annotated diagrams.

Activity: Salmon Hatchery

Participants watch a video (2.5 min) about an elementary class field trip to a salmon hatchery in which students fill out a diagram about salmon life cycles. (Source: *Molly of Denali, PBS Kids*)

Activity: Water Wheel Lesson Plan

Participants discuss a high school classroom scenario provided by ELL expert Tan Huynh.

Activity: Phases of the Moon

Participants go step by step through an activity labeling a diagram about the moon's phases.

Bonus Activities

Scaffolds and ELLs

Participants reflect on how to talk about the use of scaffolds with colleagues. A video (2.5 mins) featuring National Teacher of the Year Missy Testerman is also included.






Phases of the Moon: Diagram
